
At Montgomery Street School, kindness is a big deal! We teach students to be bucket fillers to encourage others and treat each other with respect.

What Is a Bucket Filler? – A bucket filler is someone who uses acts of kindness to make another person feel better. This could be anything! A bucket filler could say a kind word to someone who looks sad or they could help a friend in need. Being a bucket filler can be as simple as smiling at someone or giving someone a compliment!

Why Is It Important? – It's important to be a bucket filler simply because it makes others feel good. People don't feel good when their buckets are empty. However, a full bucket brings a lot of joy!
