

NOVEMBER: Diversity & Respect

We celebrate diversity at Montgomery Street School and celebrate our individual differences. Our differences make us unique! Working and playing with others provides students with the opportunity to see that everyone has special strengths and abilities.

Things to try:

- 1. Be aware of the way you speak about others who are different from yourself.
- 2. Answer questions children have about differences with honesty and respect. It's ok to notice differences as long as it's done in a respectful manner.
- 3. Recognize and respect differences within your own family. Value the uniqueness of everyone in your family--their abilities, interests, etc. celebrating differences.
- 4. Emphasize the golden rule--treat others the way you want to be treated.
- 5. Help children build their self-esteem. When children respect and value themselves, they are more likely to treat others with respect.

"It's Okay to be Different" by Todd Parr is an excellent book about differences.

The example you set through your daily

behaviour is the one your children will learn most from. The most important message to convey is that everyone is different, but each person has a heart and feelings that matter.
